ments" in Egypt, stating that the society, in particular, and Shi'ism, in general, posed a threat to the country's national unity.

"Egypt will not allow the spread of Shi'ism on its soil," he said.

Dr Ammar urged authorities to

clamp down on Al Wefaq's political activities in Egypt and called for the expulsion of all Bahrainis working for the society.

Bahraini authorities were also urged to stop Al Wefaq leaders' trips to Egypt. "We have closely followed

movements of Al Wefaq secretarygeneral Shaikh Ali Salman in Cairo. The presence of pro-Iranian agents on Egyptian soil is a threat to the country's unity and the true Islamic religion," the council said, calling for the expulsion of all pro-Iranians resid-

ing in the country.

The council also announced a massive summit to "expose the Iranian plot to export Shi'ism" to Egypt and other Arab countries. It will also announce a list of "pro-Iranians who support the expansion of Shi'ism" in the country.

Dr Ammar called for the formation of an Arab popular front to counter the Safavid Shi'ism tide.

He urged all revolutionary entities and political societies to stage a sitin, in front of Bahrain's Embassy in Cairo, today to protest against the activities of Al Wefaq on Egyptian soil.

The council said it will fight any party that considered Egypt a land to fulfil their aggressive motives against the Arab world, Al Khaleej reported.

### Biggest oil tank farm

MUSCAT: Oman is considering building a facility to store up to 200 million barrels of crude safely outside the Strait of Hormuz, Oman Oil Company chairman Nasser Al Jashmi said yesterday. The proposed facility would be larger than any other tank farm in the world. Working crude storage capacity at Cushing in the US is around 62m barrels. Iran has repeatedly threatened to block the narrow shipping lanes between Oman and Iran through which over a third of all sea-borne traded oil is shipped each day, as tensions with the West over Tehran's nuclear plans have intensified.
