Behind a storm shutter, a leaded-glass door swings open and brings one into the chapel of this intriguing structure that was dedicated in 1912, after being constructed at a cost of \$709.81 by A. D. McCormick. The distinguished founder of this Episcopal chapel-at-ease for summer services was the Reverend Francis Joseph Hall of Chicago, who had come to the area as a pioneer resorter in 1902. He began celebrating the service of Holy Communion at an early hour every Sunday in his study, using a small altar that he had constructed

for that purpose and that for many years was used in St. John-by-the-Lake.
