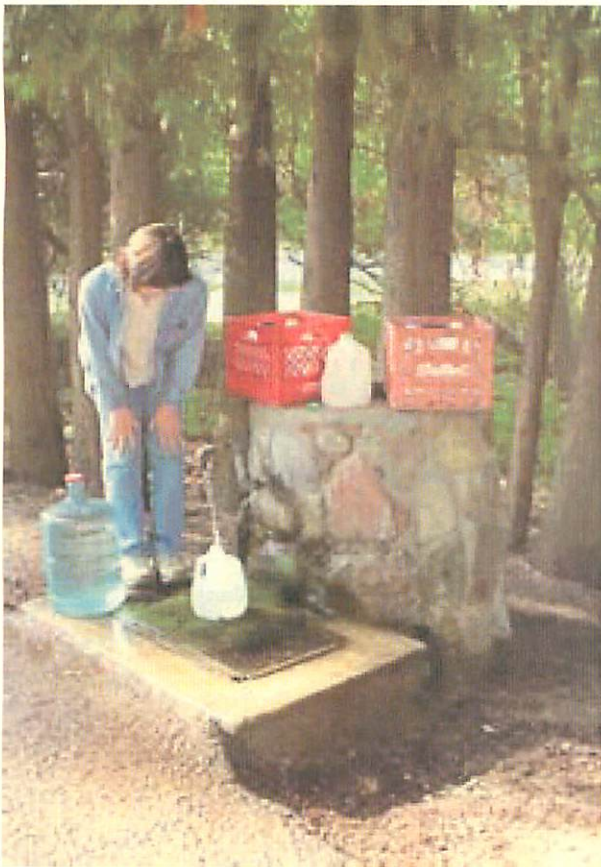

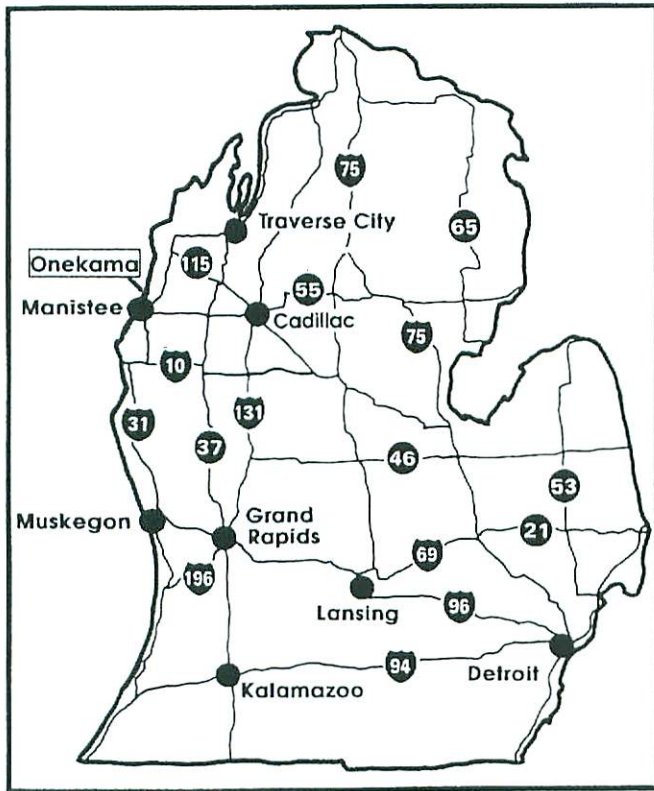

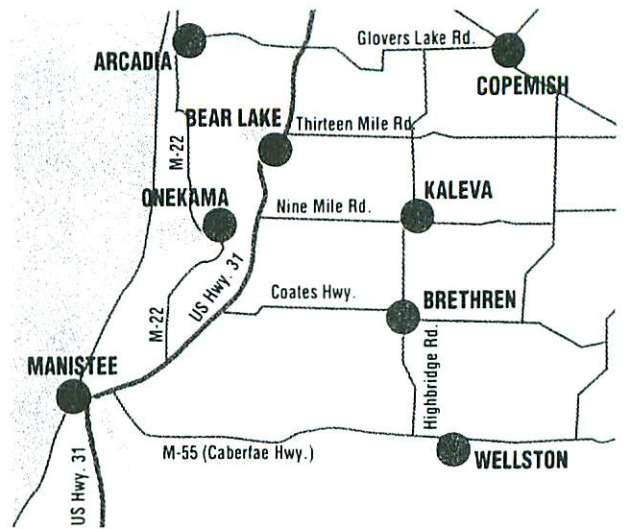

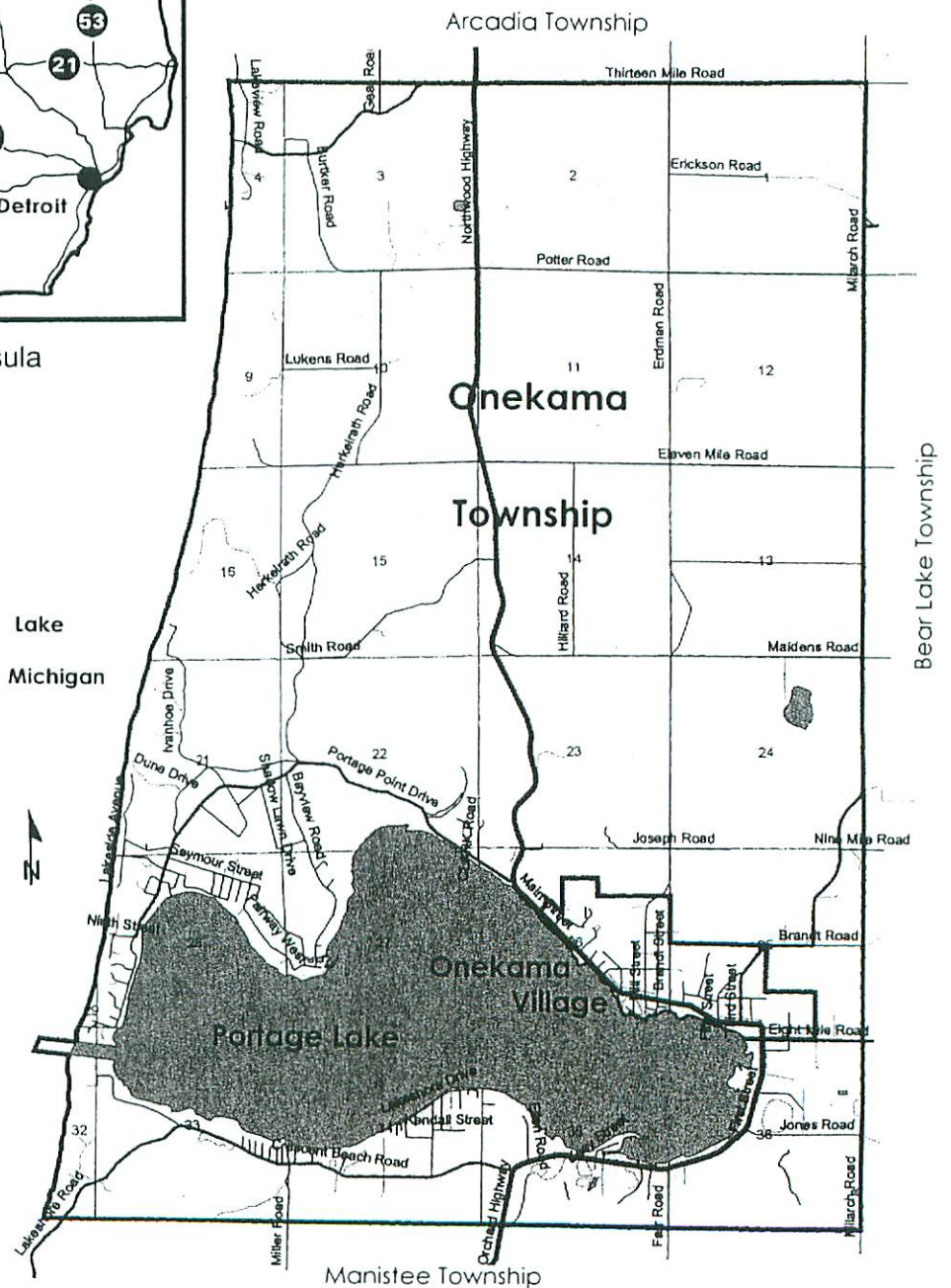
Onekama Township and Village Location Maps



Michigan Lower Peninsula



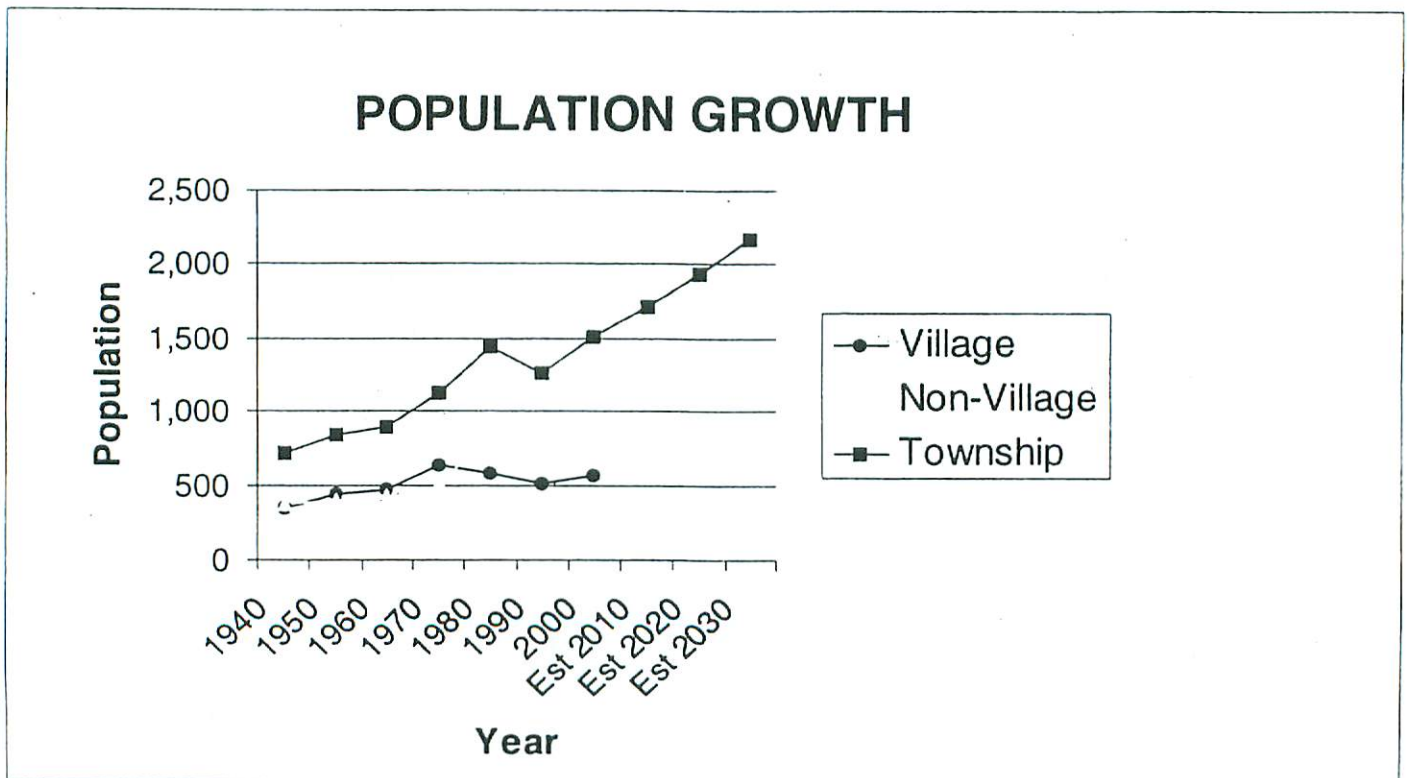

Onekama Township Topography



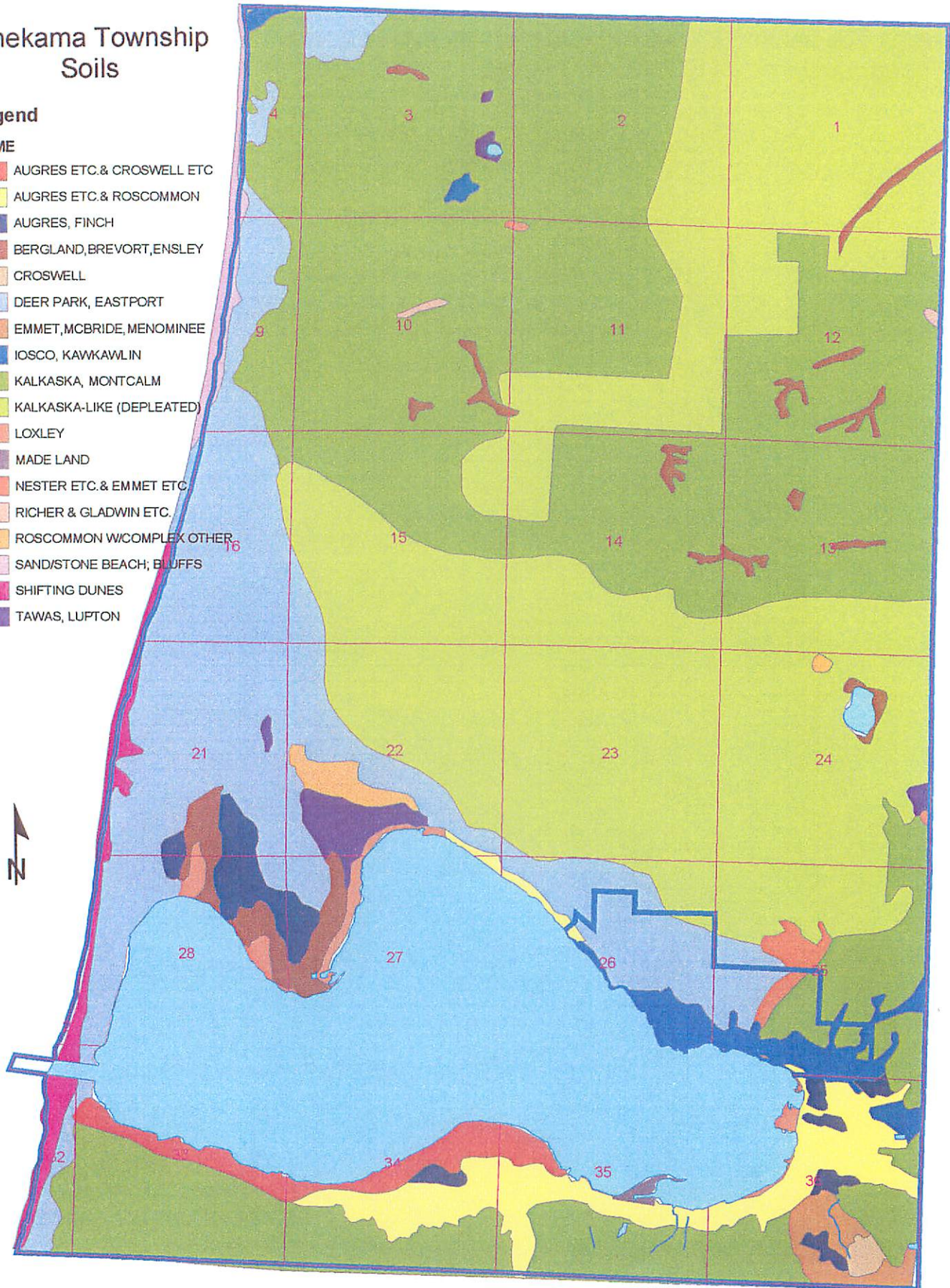

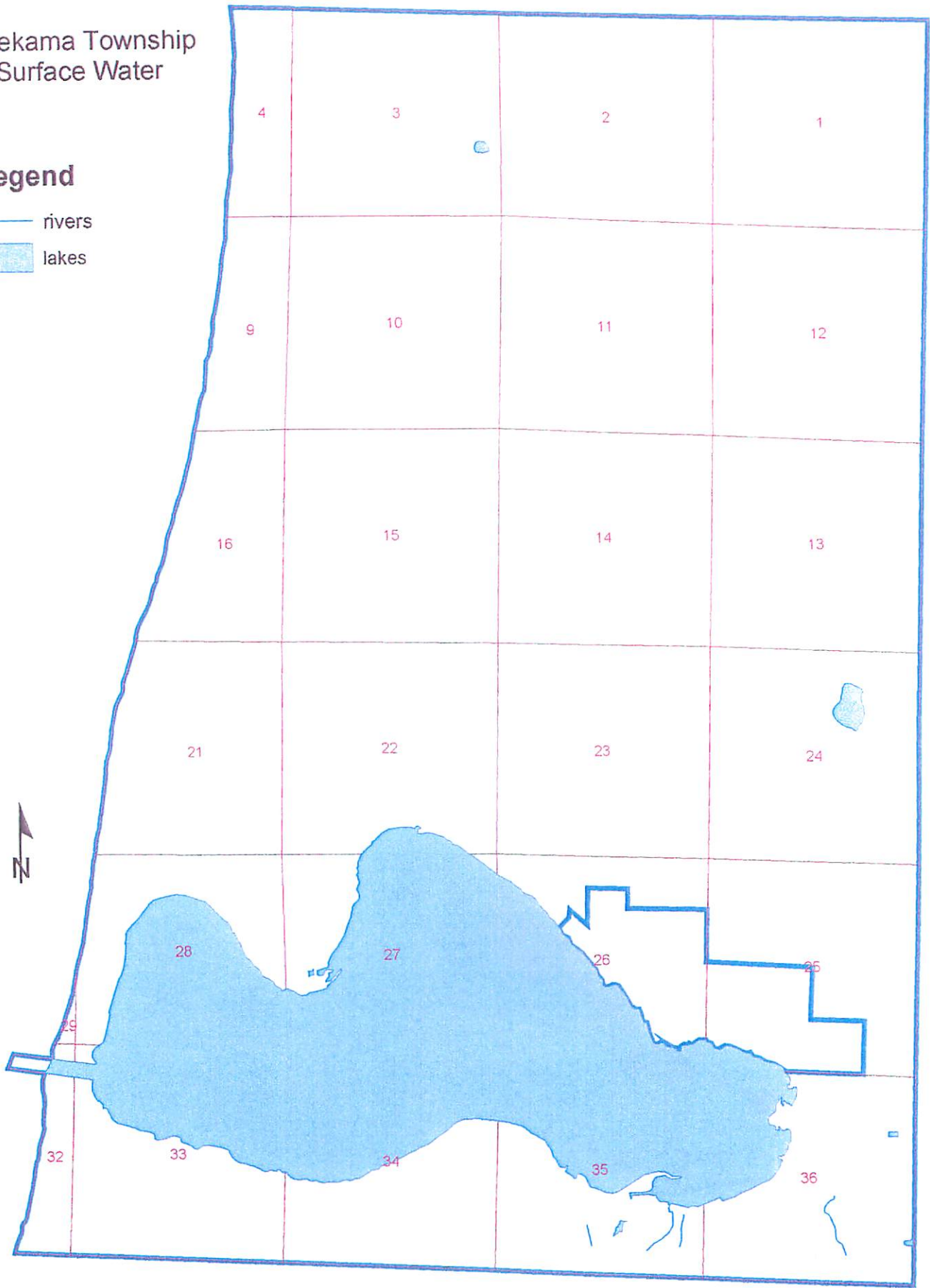

Onekama Township Surface Water

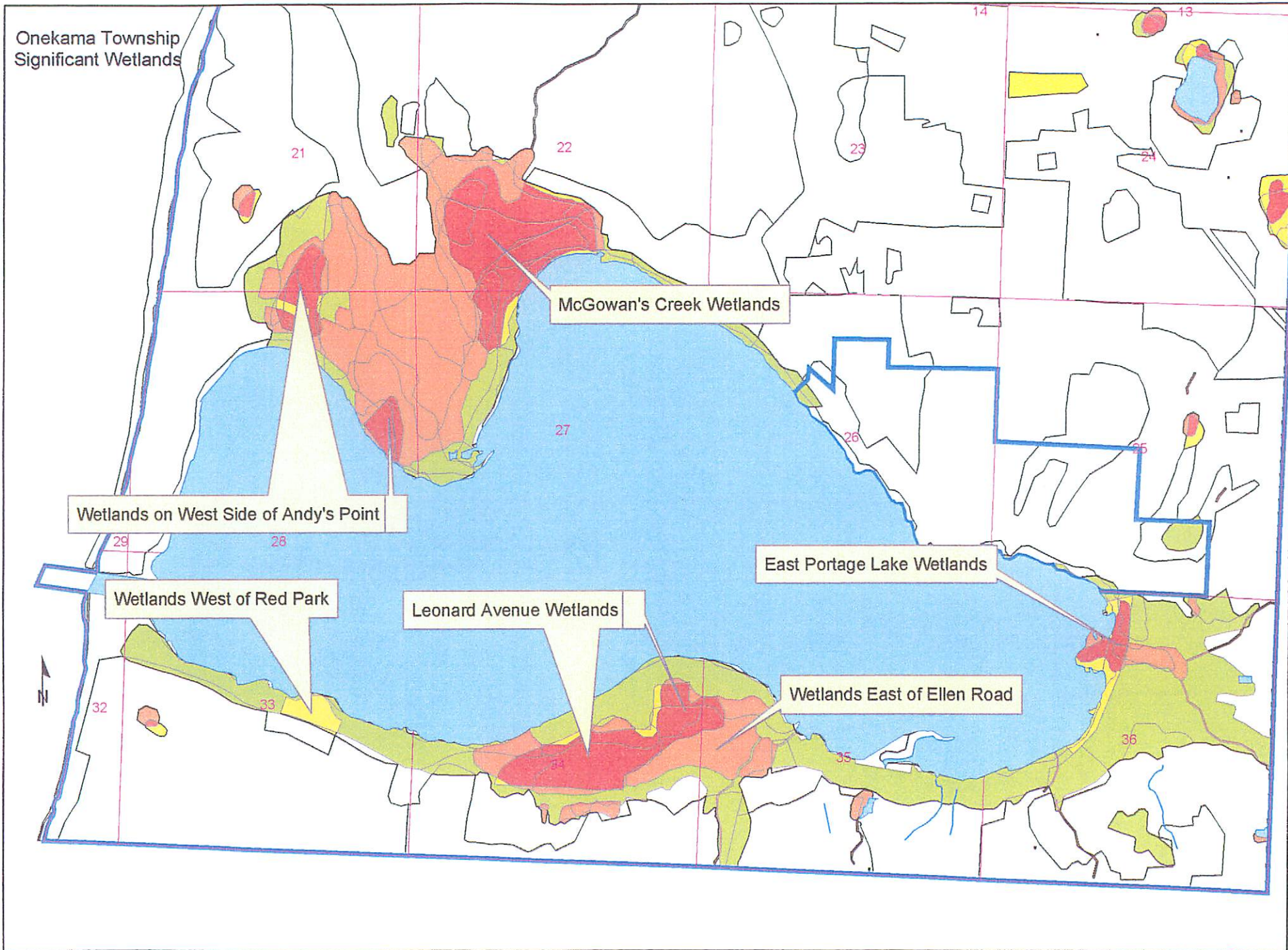

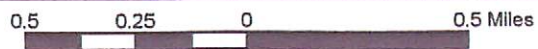

Significant Wetlands



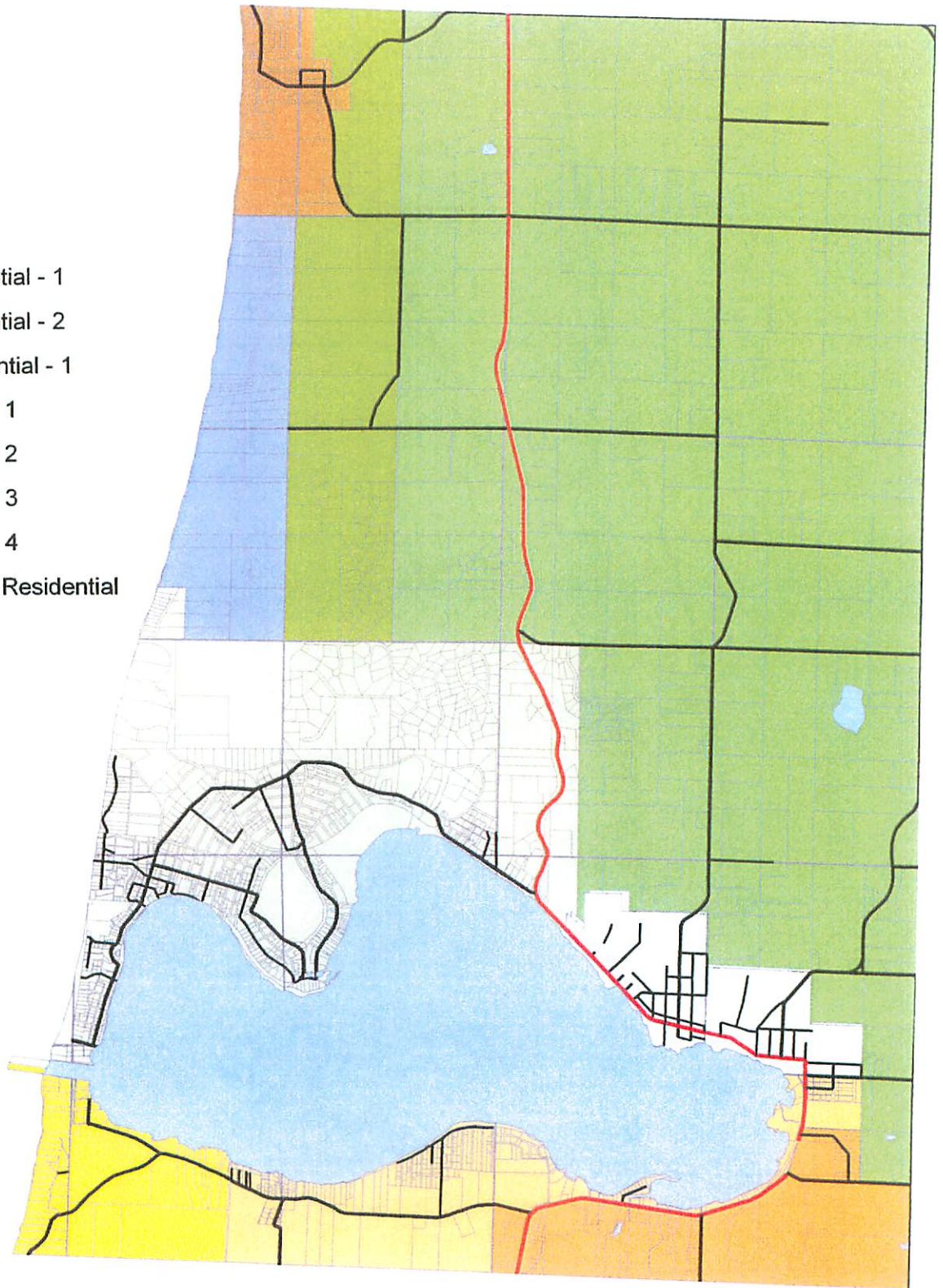

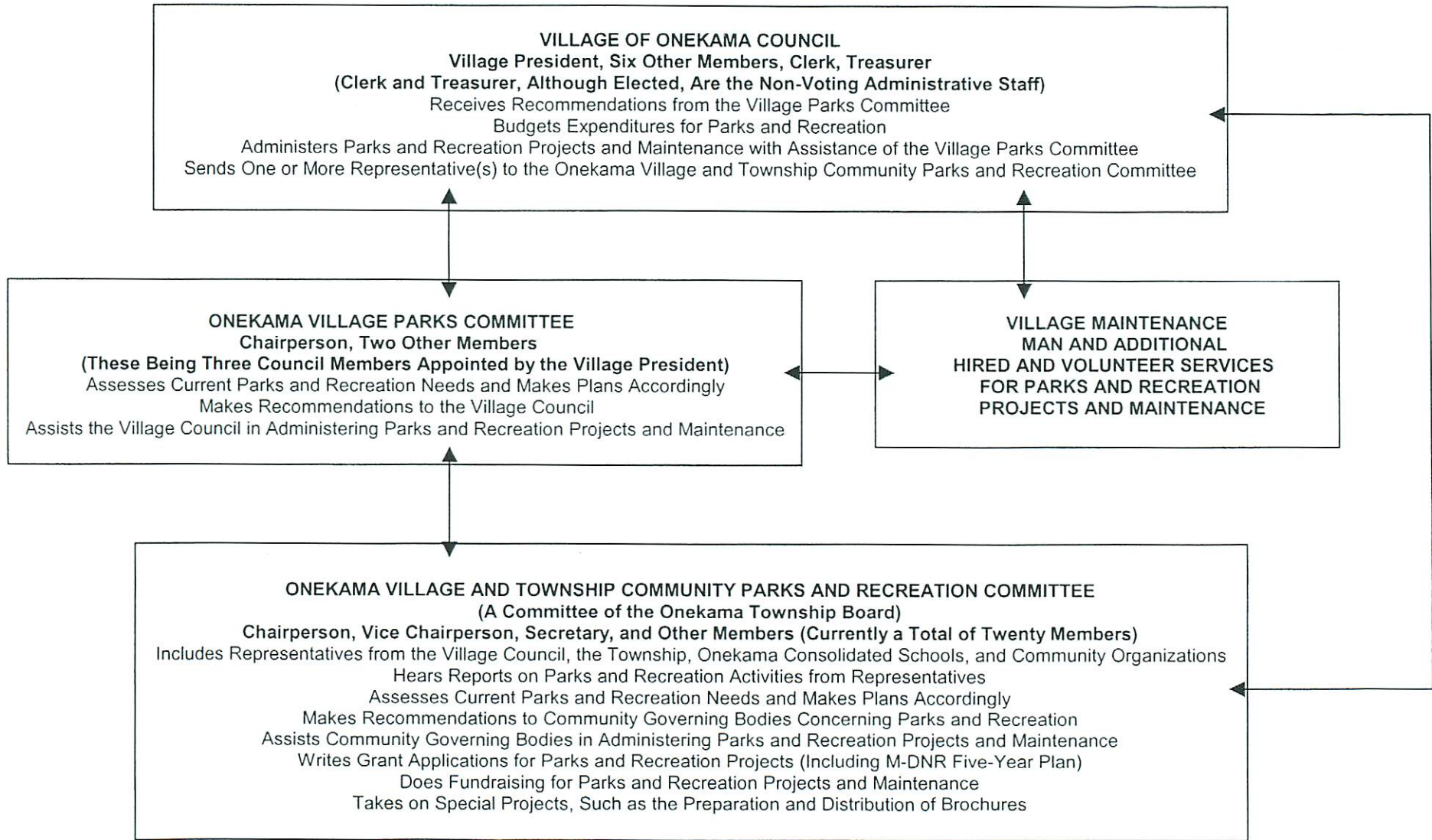

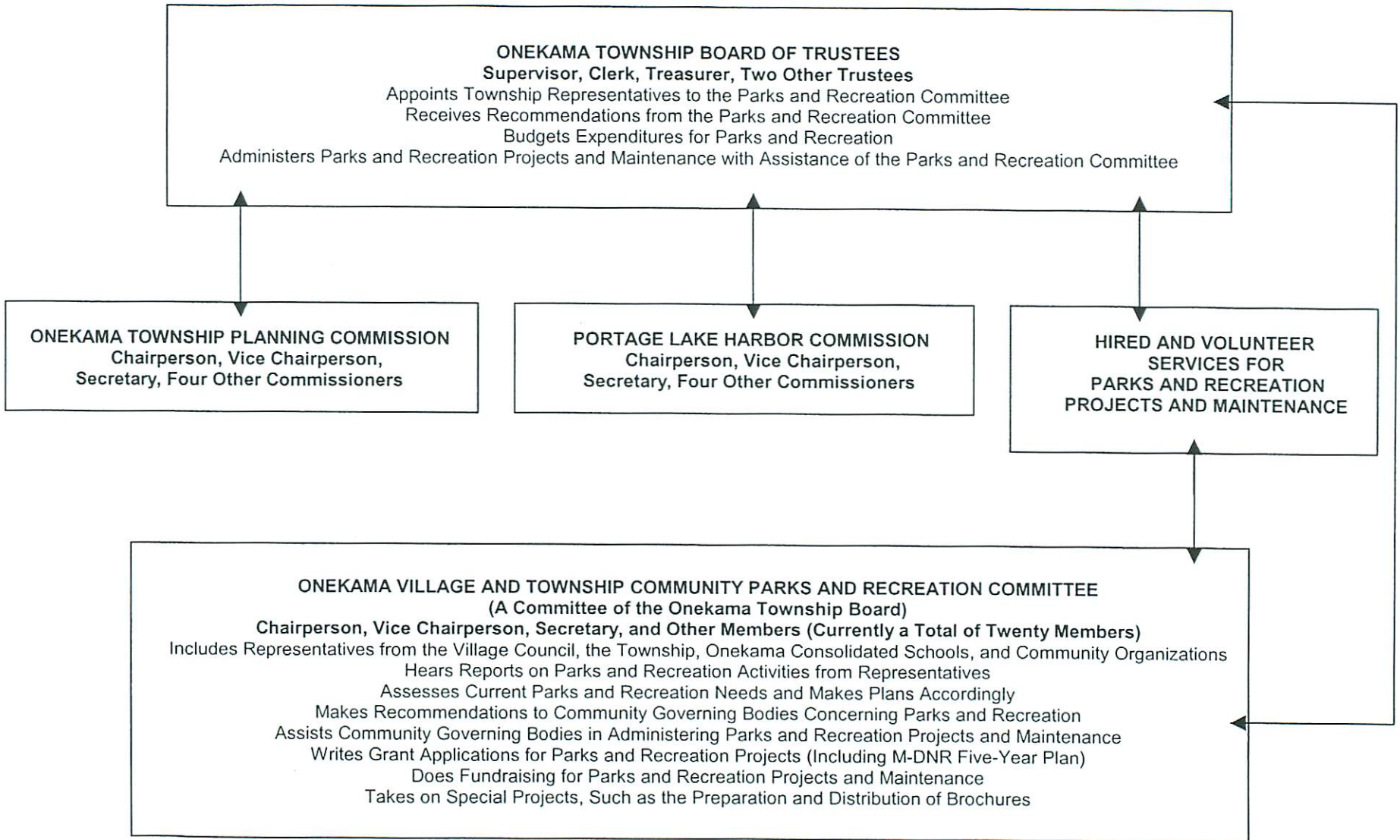

Village of Onekama Organization Chart for Parks and Recreation

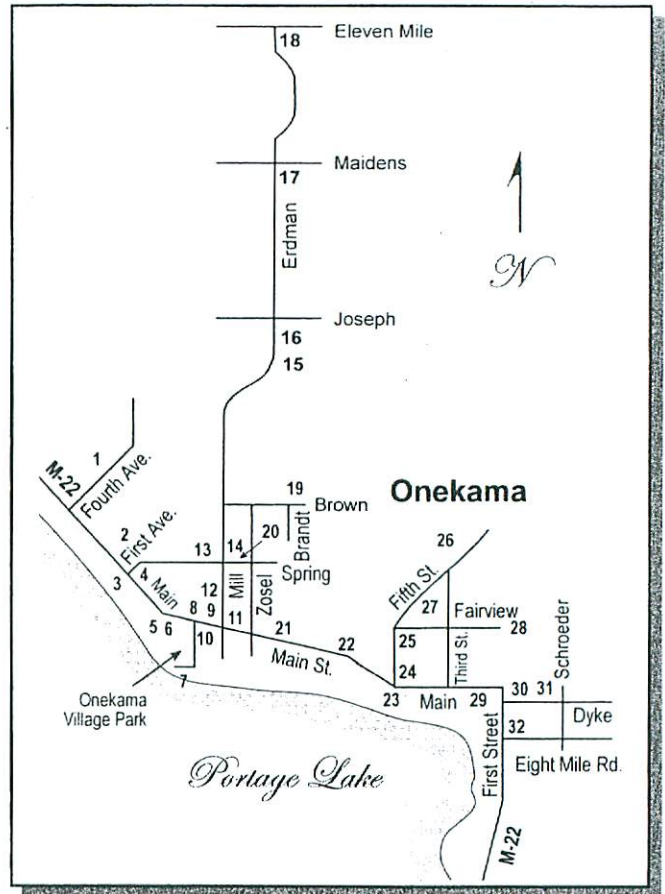


Onekama Township Organization Chart for Parks and Recreation

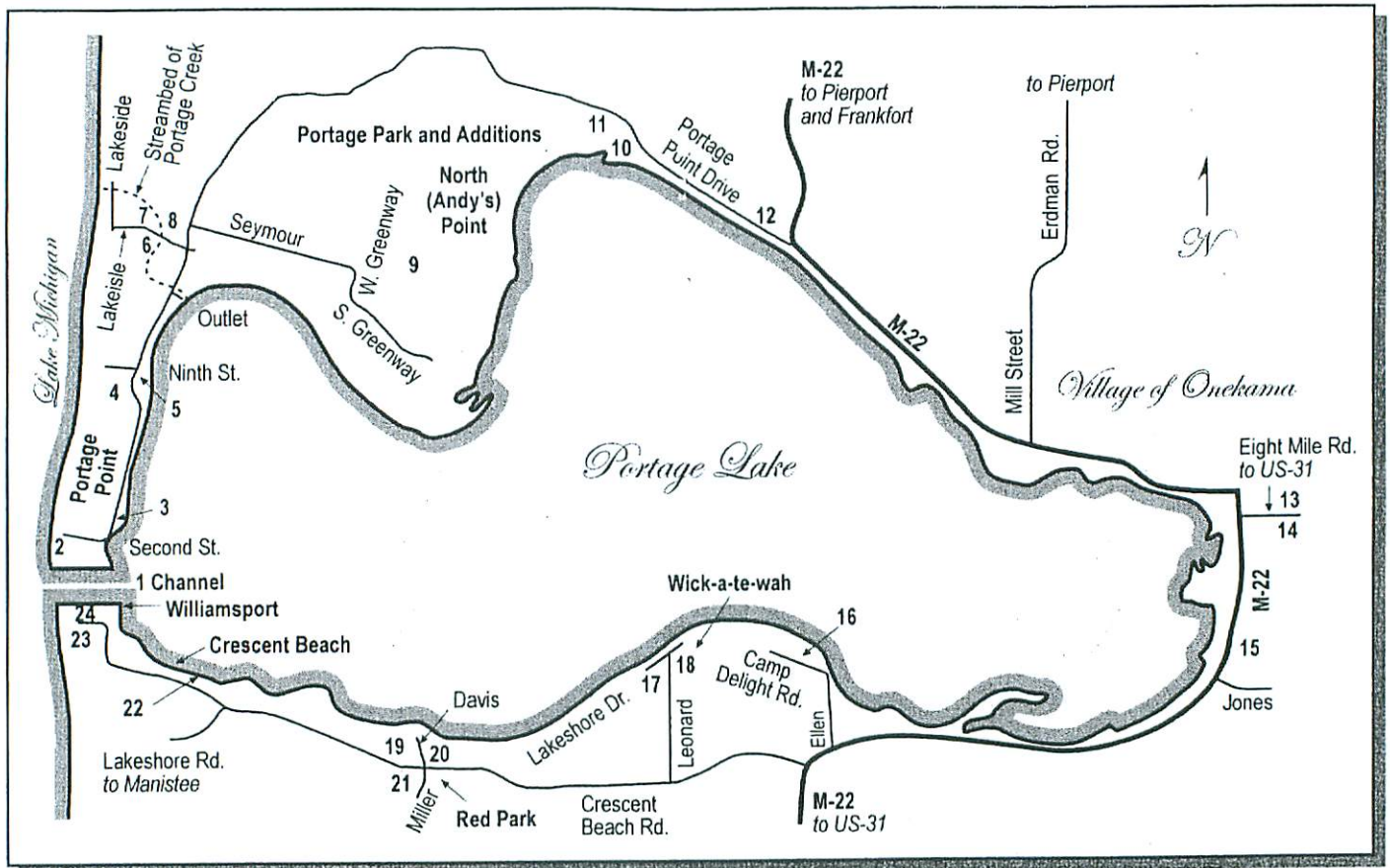
