This site was born, in its crudest form [v0.0.0], last August. It started out as nothing more than a couple of pages and lots of ideas. A few major modifications and design choices later, a template and feel were chosen from the many potentials on OSWD. The one I use, Whompy, is horribly complex, but perfect for the look and feel I was going for - cold, dark, impersonal, and all that sort of thing. Very me. With that done, the basic structure was laid out and a lot of hacking then went into simplifying things (for frequent updates) and making sure it passes validation parsers. I then bought a camera, and it's been slowly getting more populated with pictures, and is the fastest growing portion of the site, in terms of hit gathering. Also around this time, I had hacked a blog code, b2, to match the site (almost) and linked off to a blog that I've been actually maintaining quite regularly since the beginning of the year. I've always had a blog, but never updated so often, or lived so long.

I would have liked it if the year didn't end with a beta release [v0.1.3b], but ah well, basically, the going's been good. There is a LOT more to do of course, but things are falling into place quite well given the time I have to work on this. Now that it is out of its teething phase, things should go on pretty smoothly. I hope. The TO DO list pretty much sums up a good chunk of what's not done, yet.
