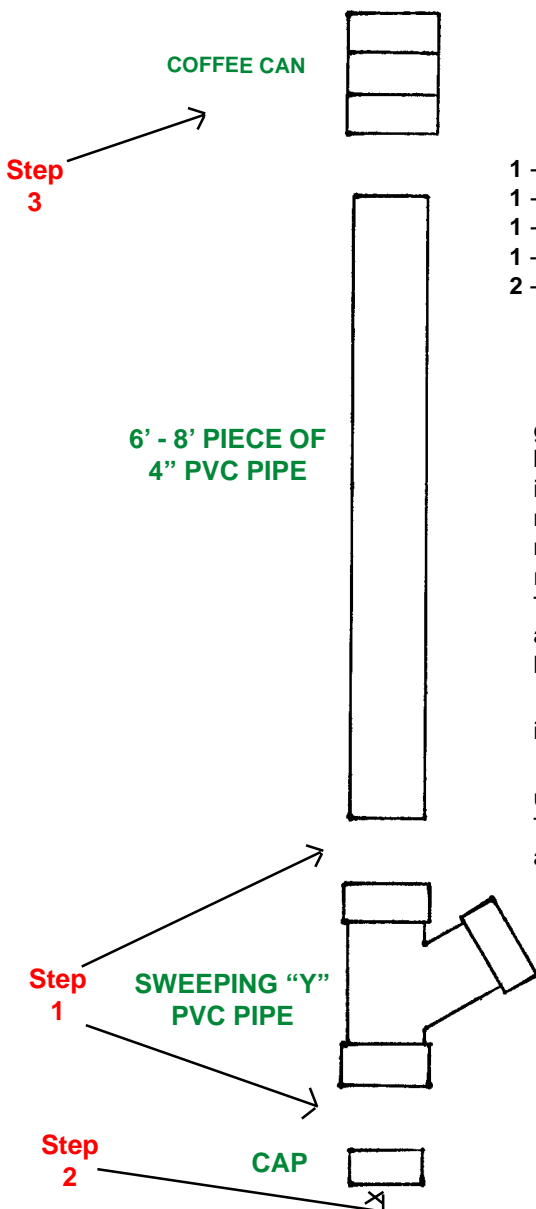


Deer/Turkey Feeder



MATERIALS

- 1 - 6 - 8' PIECE OF 4" PVC PIPE
- 1 - 4" PVC SWEETING "Y" FITTING
- 1 - 4" PVC CAP
- 1 - EMPTY COFFEE CAN
- 2 - 18" BUNGEE CORDS

STEP #1. Use PVC or hot glue to glue the pipe, sweeping "Y", and the bottom cap together. PVC pipe comes in different thicknesses. The most common is about 1/4" thick and is used in most homes. This type is heavy, and really isn't practical for a deer feeder. The pipe you'll need is about 1/8" thick, and is available at most hardware and home improvement centers.

STEP #2. Drill several small holes in the bottom of the cap for drainage.

STEP #3. Place an old coffee can upside down on top the pipe for a lid. This will keep out snow and rain water and prevent it from rotting the feed.

STEP #4. Fill the feeder with cracked corn and bungee cord it to a small tree. If you plan to use your feeder on state land, you may want to paint it to help prevent theft.
