The Ypsilanti Math Corps at U(M) is a free four-week Summer Camp for middle school students and high school mentors from the Ypsilanti area.



Closely following the educational and mentoring practices of the *Math Corps*, a phenomenal program that started in 1992 at Wayne State University in Detroit, the Ypsilanti Math Corps at U(M) started in Summer 2019 at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. We had 40 middle schoolers and 20 high schoolers in our program. The high school students were teaching assistants who mentored the middle school students.



The Math Corps is about more than math skills: we prioritize mentorship through a kids-teaching-kids model, providing a positive learning environment and a strong sense of family. Everyone in our camp did amazingly well!! In just four weeks, every single camper showed significant improvement. We are looking for resources to help fund the program in Summer 2020 and beyond.
