## TOP COMMUNITY COLLEGE

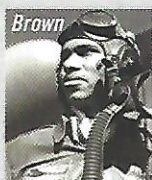

**Roscoe C. Brown Jr.**, 94, president of Bronx Community College from 1977 to 1993 and then the director of the Center for Education Policy at the CUNY Graduate Center. He was a Tuskegee airman in World War II and looked to as a voice of reason in New York City during the racial volatility of the 1970s and '80s.



**John F. Timoney**, 68, John Jay College of Criminal Justice, B.A.; Hunter College, M.A., the youngest Chief of the New York City Police Department, then police commissioner in Philadelphia and police chief in Miami, reforming police procedures in all three cities.

**Stanley T. Lewis**, 89, professor in the Graduate School of Library and Information Studies at Queens College, 1967-1987; director of the ARTDOC/NY video project (1974-1976)

**Fred Hellerman**, 89, Brooklyn College '49, the last original member of the Weavers. With Pete Seeger, Lee Hays and Ronnie Gilbert, Hellerman (bottom right) founded the group that would bring folk music to millions of listeners.
